

St. Malo Annual Family Hockey Tournament

Rules and Regulations

- All team members must be related to the team manager except the goalie. The family relation to the manager must be as follows:
 - Brother or Sister
 - Brother in law or sister in law
 - Son or Daughter
 - Son in law or daughter in law
 - Grand-son or Grand-daughter
 - Niece or Nephew
 - Niece in law or Nephew in law
 - 1st, 2nd or 3rd cousins
 - 1st, 2nd or 3rd cousins in law
- Any exceptions to #1 must have permission from the organizing committee.** A boyfriend or a girlfriend of a relative must have lived common law for at least one year.
- Players can only play for one team during the weekend.
- Games are 3 twelve minute periods. All 3 periods are stop time.
- If a team is leading by 7 points or more after the second period, the clock will then run straight time. If there is less than a 7 point spread afterwards the clock will then run on stop time.
- The player's stick must not leave the ice on a shot. If a player's stick does leave the ice, a face-off will be held in that team's zone.
- Absolutely **NO** body contact is allowed. If a body contact or body check occurs, the player will serve a 2 minute minor penalty.
- A player who receives 3 minor penalties will be removed from that game. If that occurs to the same player in a second game, that player will not be allowed to play for the remainder of the tournament.
- Any 5 minute major, fighting or attempt to injure penalty, that player will not be allowed to play for the remainder of the tournament.
- All games must end with a winner and a loser. Therefore if a game ends in a tie, a shootout will occur where each team will appoint 3 different shooters. The shooters will continue until a winner is evident. If tied after the 3 shooters have shot, teams must choose a different player. No player is to shoot more than once.
- The tournament will follow all MAHA rules other than indicated.
- All players must be 14 years or older **within the calendar year of the event.**
- Alcohol is not allowed in the arena except in licensed and permitted designated area.
